Cabinet NG software puts documents at fingertips

Company helps its customers move to electronic files

Manila envelopes and metal cabinets have gone by the wayside for a growing number of businesses that now manage their files with software from a Madison company.

Cabinet NG (Next Generation) relocated from Athens to Madison in December.

"We offer a software solution that takes your physical filing, all the documents in your filing cabinets, and creates that in an electronic version," said Jim True, vice president of marketing and business development for the company, which was founded in 1992. "It's a complete document management solution." In such programs as Windows, "You're working on a document, you open up Word, you start typing away and the phone rings," True said. Not only must you end and save the document, "You have to remember where you saved it and what you titled it."

Cabinet NG software helps customers find files "virtually instantly when you need them," True said. "We start filing as you start typing." The software creates naming templates "so you can quickly search and retrieve documents," he said.

The majority of the company's customers find Cabinet NG at www.cabinetng.com. "We target the small to midsize market, primarily in the manufacturing and financial industries," True said. The company also provides software for some state and local governments and medical accounts.

"You could put it into the document management or content management category, but it also has a lot of workflow functions," True said. The privately owned company has 13 employees and is quickly growing, "between 30 (percent) and 40 percent for the last four years," he said.

The company chose to locate in Madison for several reasons. "We like the facility better here as well as being more centralized to a greater pool of talent," True said.
